I INTEND TO SHOW THE COURT

With my questions to officer CORONADO I intend to show the Court that for the purpose of "teaching me a lesson" about declining a search of my Motor Home when offered by Texas Department of Public Safety officer CORONADO, and using the authority of his office, I was compelled to endure a several hour long delay in my travel and a false detainment of my person, further I was compelled to helplessly stand by and watch a deliberate act of vandalism against my Motor Home intentionally conducted off camera with four K9 search dogs allowing the expensive damage to my Motor Home's paint to occur, further I was compelled to withstand a several hour long humiliating search of the interior of my Motor Home by the four K9 police dogs and the four Law Enforcement officers without loosing my cool and making things worst by blowing up from the anger I felt. Then I was given a Warning Ticket at the end of the day after I asked for the names and contact information of everyone who was physically present inside my Motor Home. Immediately after I completed cleaning up the mess I was left with, I wrote my Memo and I went to the following officials at these police organizations and asked for official investigation of this serious incident, giving them a verbal description of the event along with a copy of my Memo and the Warning Ticket for their records. I allowed three years for any investigations that may have been started to complete before I returned to Texas to seek closure and relief in Court from the Defendant and I have not visited Texas since I was here last time in March 2001. This serious incident has strongly deterred me from traveling in Texas with my Motor Home ever again, it has left me with a "lesson learned" that I will likely remember the rest of my life about what did happen upon declining a search of my Motor Home when offered by the Texas DPS officer.
